

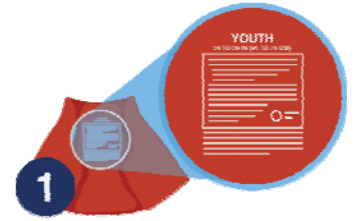
# Founga totonu hono tui 'o e saketi kakau malu'i mo'ui'

## How To Properly Fit a Life Jacket

1

Kataki 'o fakapapau'i ke 'uluaki lau 'a e ngaahi fakahinohino ki hono ngaue'aki 'oe saketi kakau alu'i moui pea vakai'i mo hono mamafa fakataha moe falahi 'o e fatafata ke feunga lelei.

Check life vest label for the appropriate weight or chest size.

Tui leva 'a e saketi kakau malu'i moui.

Put the life vest on.

Fakama'u 'a e ngaahi me'a ha'i ke ma'u lelei pea fusi 'a e sipa ke 'au.

Buckle all straps and tighten or zip up all zippers.

Fekau leva ki he tokotaha 'oku ne tui 'a e saketi kakau malu'i moui ke hiki 'a hono ongo nima ki 'olunga 'o mafao ki 'olunga 'i hono 'ulu, pea fusi'i fakalelei ki 'olunga 'aki 'a hono puke'i mei he 'ongo kong'a 'o e uma 'i he saketi kakau.

Have the wearer lift their arms over head and gently lift them by the top of the life vest arm openings.



Kapau 'e heke 'a e saketi ki 'olunga 'i hono telinga, koe saketi ko eni 'oku fu'u lahi ia. Kapau 'oku 'ikai ke mapuni lelei 'a e ngaahi ha'i moe sipa, ta koe saketi 'oku fu'u si'isi'i aupito ia ki he tokotaha ko eni kene tui.

If the vest rides up above their ears, then it is too big. If the straps or zippers do not close, then the vest is too small.
